Designed to enhance linguistic proficiency, particularly among students with diverse backgrounds in English, the course provided a foundational framework for effective communication and academic engagement. The assessment conducted at the conclusion of the program reflected commendable outcomes, with 14 out of 53 participants achieving a score of 80% or above. In recognition of their successful completion, all participants will be awarded a Certificate of Appreciation. This bridge course proved to be an invaluable academic intervention. equipping incoming students with essential language competencies and fostering a more inclusive and linguistically empowered learning environment

National Service Scheme (NSS): The National Service Scheme (NSS) Unit No. 267 of the college, affiliated with the University of Calicut, has been a catalyst for social transformation, engaging in impactful initiatives such as campus clean-ups, community welfare projects, and socially relevant awareness programs. Through these activities, the unit has consistently upheld its commitment to fostering social responsibility and civic engagement among students.

A highlight of the year was the seven-day residential camp, held at St. Mary's L.P.S, Karingadu, Thottilpalam, from February 2-9, 2025. This intensive programme not only facilitated meaningful social reconstruction efforts but also served as a dynamic platform for collaborative learning, leadership development, and community engagement. Under the dedicated guidance of Mrs. Shyni N., the Unit Coordinator, the camp empowered volunteers with experiential learning opportunities that extended beyond conventional classroom education.

The resounding success of the camp was made possible by the unwavering support and goodwill of Rev. Fr. Jinoy George, Manager of St. Mary's L.P.S., and the Kavilumpara Grama Panchayat authorities. Their generous contributions and logistical support played a pivotal role in ensuring the seamless execution of this transformative initiative. Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC): The Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) of the college, under the coordination of Mr. Rejish M, has been actively engaged in the preparatory efforts for NAAC accreditation. As part of this

initiative, a dedicated workspace has been established to facilitate its operations, with significant preliminary groundwork already completed. To further streamline the accreditation process, Sr. Gracelin K. Joseph serves as the NAAC Accreditation Coordinator, providing crucial support to the IQAC's functions. The continued strengthening and systematic enhancement of the IQAC's activities would be highly valued by the college community, ensuring sustained progress in quality assurance and institutional excellence.

Launching of the New Website: In strategic partnership with Carmel Lights Technologies, the college has deployed a scalable, cloud-native dynamic website (*www.mtcpba.com*) on July 23, 2024, provisioned with 25GB of dedicated storage. This platform features an integrated, modular accreditation data repository, engineered to support the evolving Binary Accreditation Scheme mandated by NAAC. The site has demonstrated significant user engagement, achieving a cumulative viewership of 5,400 within the initial eight months of operation, translating to an average of approximately 25+ views per day.

DELNET Digital Library: Recognizing the evolving needs of teacher education, our college has recently enhanced its library resources through a subscription to DELNET, a prominent digital library consortium. This initiative grants our faculty and student-teachers access to a vast network of over 8,600 higher education institutions across 26 Indian states. Notably, we are the only unaided teacher education college affiliated with Calicut University to leverage the extensive resources offered by DELNET. We anticipate a significant surge in the utilization of these digital resources as our college community integrates them into their teaching, research, and professional development activities, thereby enriching the pedagogical foundation of our future educators

Induction Ceremony: The official induction ceremony for the new B.Ed. batch of 2024-26 was held on July 23, 2024, in a grand and ceremonious manner, honoring the rich legacy of the college and the solemnity of the course declaration. Rev. Fr. Johny Kanjirathinkal CMI graced the occasion as the chief celebrant, marking the beginning of the academic journey of the new batch with reverence, inspiration and focus.

Research and Extension Wing: On July 23, 2024, the college also inaugurated its Research and Extension Wing, under the coordination of Sr. Gracelin K. Joseph. Dr, Amruth G. Kumar, Dean of Education, Central University of Kerala, Kasargodu was the chief guest of the function. This initiative aims to foster both research and development, as well as strengthen our connection with the wider community. As part of its early outreach, the center recently conducted an umbrella assembling training session for student-teachers, in conjunction with a community living camp.

Blood Donation Camp: The Extension Wing of the college, in collaboration with the Merchant Association Youth Wing of Perambra, organized a Blood Donation Camp on November 6, 2025. A dedicated medical team from the Government Beach Hospital, Kozhikode, efficiently managed the technical logistics of the camp. Demonstrating a strong spirit of community service, the staff, students, and members of the public collectively donated 43 units of blood.

Best Outgoing Student Awards: A significant innovation of the current academic year is the establishment of the 'Best Outgoing Student' award. Recognizing the imperative to foster student excellence and diverse capabilities within contemporary educational frameworks, the college adopted a participatory selection process. Through a democratic approach, students from each optional class identified their respective best outgoing representatives: Anugraha G. (English), Sreelakshmi S, (Mathematics), Anupama V. (Physical Science), and Vismaya M. M. (Social Science). Subsequently, the faculty members conducted a rigorous adjudication process to determine the recipient of the prestigious 'Best Outgoing Student' award, ultimately conferred upon

The College Library: The college library serves as the central hub for knowledge acquisition and distribution. Equipped with digital resources, including a DELNET connection, and enhanced by the addition of new books and periodicals, the library provides comprehensive support. Its info-graphic service offers cost-effective printouts and handouts to students and faculty. Currently, the library houses 9,805 volumes, and the implementation of KOHA-based full automation is underway. Mr. Surendran P. G., the dedicated librarian, is commended for his exemplary service.

Canteen Rejuvenation: The college canteen, revitalized under the diligent management of Mr. Surendran P G and Mrs. Syamala K., provides a valuable space for student-teachers and staff to relax and socialize. Offering a selection of coffee, tea, and snacks, the canteen serves as a welcome respite within the academic environment. Furthermore, efforts are underway to reinstate the Honesty Self-Help Store, with the goal of resuming its operations in the near future.

Staff Welfare Self-Help Chitty: The well-being of faculty and staff is fundamental to the progressive growth of any institution. Recognizing this, the staff members of this college have initiated a self-help monthly chitty, beginning this year. This chitty requires a contribution of ₹1000 per participant. Mr. Surendran P G will coordinate the monthly auctions and lotteries.

Sewing Machine Distribution: On August 19, 2024, the College, in partnership with the St. Thomas Association for Rural Development of the CMI, distributed 25 sewing machines to deserving women entrepreneurs in and around Perambra. The event took place at the college, with Fr. Jose Prakash CMI and Mr. Robin Mathew serving as the guests of honor. The program received logistical support from the extension wing and the NSS unit.

Skill Enhancement courses: Basics of Embroidery and Stitching and Classical Dance Training and Appreciation: Danspiration: With the goal of fostering peer-tutoring and collaborative learning among the 2024-26 batch of student-teachers, the college administration introduced two innovative Skill Embroidery Enhancement Courses this vear: **Basics** of and Stitching and Classical Dance Training and Appreciation: Danspiration. These courses were designed to provide hands-on learning experiences while nurturing creativity and teamwork. A unique aspect of the program was the identification of course instructors through a talent exploration process linked to admission counseling. Ms. Nandhana V. K. (English); Mrs. AryaGirish P. M. (Physical Science); and Mr. Rishinlal K. K. (Social Science), volunteered to serve as instructors for the Stitching and Danspiration courses, respectively. Upon successful completion of all tasks and modules, participants will be awarded merit certificates, recognizing their dedication and achievements in these specialized areas. This initiative reflects the college's commitment to holistic education and skill development beyond traditional academics.

PWD friendly Campus Modification: The campus has been made more inclusive and accessible for persons with disabilities by installing a ramp and constructing a new washroom on the ground floor during this academic year.

Study Kit Distribution to adopted school students: In celebration of World Environment Day on June 5, 2025, the Eco Club and NSS unit of the 2023-25 batch came together in a meaningful initiative, collecting study materials and generously gifting them to the students of our adopted school, MLPS Maruthery, located near the college.

Self-Learning MOOC Course: In continuation of the prior year's established practice, the Admission Counselling session for first-year Student-Teachers featured advisory of structured self-learning components. Specifically, all 2024-26 batch candidates have achieved completion of a self-selected Massive Open Online Course (MOOC). Furthermore, the Google Certified Teacher-Grade I certification program is underway, with students at diverse stages of completion.

Examinations and Results: The College's commitment to academic rigour was evidenced bv its comprehensive internal examination periodic encompassing assessments. mid-semester evaluations. preparatory model examinations. Building upon last year's initiative, the seamless integration of PO/CO grids with question papers was maintained. The institution's dedication to excellence culminated in a flawless 100% pass rate in the university examinations, adorned with numerous distinctions and first-class honors. Notably, Mr. Kiran Ramesh of the English Department distinguished himself as the top scorer for the 2022-24 academic year, achieving an impressive 1535 out of 1750 marks. The smooth conduct of these examinations was ensured under the stewardship of Prof. Dr. K. Y. Benedict, Principal cum Chief Superintendent, and Mrs. Shiney N, Deputy Chief. The meticulous contributions of: Sri. Jiju Thomas, Office Superintendent, Mrs. Smitha Mathew, Administrative Assistant, and Mrs. Syamala K. the house keeping assistant are hereby gratefully acknowledged.

Practice Teaching, Internship and External Examination Board Visit: The academic year's rigorous Practice Teaching and Internship programme was strategically executed in two distinct phases. The initial phase, dedicated to Upper Primary School instruction, spanned from August 14th to October 21st. Subsequently, the High School phase, providing experience in secondary education, was conducted from November 5th, 2023, to January 7th, 2024. This immersive school-based experience was facilitated by the invaluable collaboration of twenty partner schools within the Perambra region, fostering a rich learning environment for our student-teachers. The culmination of this practical training was marked by the External Examination Board's assessment, conducted by the University of Calicut on January 21st and 22nd, 2024, evaluating the progress and proficiency of the 2023-25 cohort. We express our sincere appreciation to our dedicated lab schools for their unwavering support and commitment throughout the duration of this vital programme.

Staff Council: The Staff Council, the driving force behind academic and cocurricular excellence, convened 33 times, exhibiting meticulous planning and rigorous execution. The successful realization of the academic calendar and strategic objectives reflects their collective dedication. Special recognition is due to Mrs. Swaroopa P. K., whose role as Staff Secretary was vital in accomplishing the targets of the Staff Council, this year.

College Guidance Service: The college's strategic guidance service, led by Rev. Fr. Joseph Vayalil and reinforced by the Principal and faculty, provides structured consultations.
