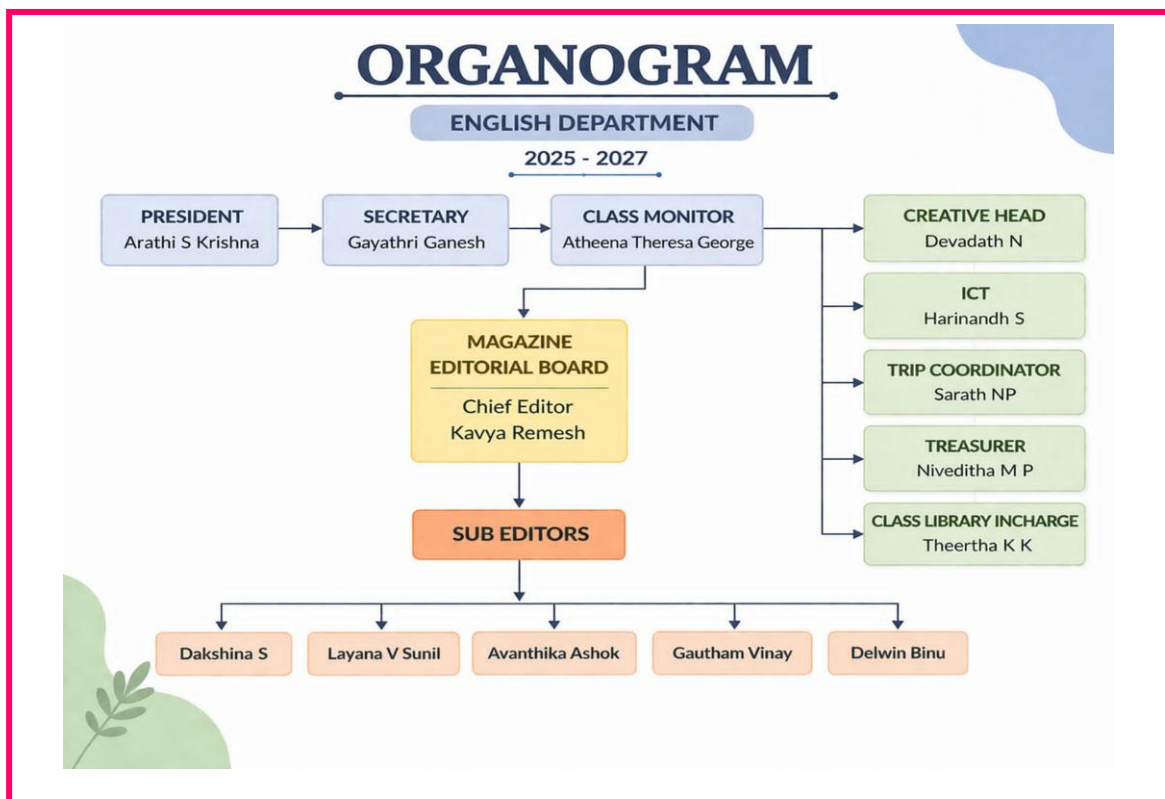

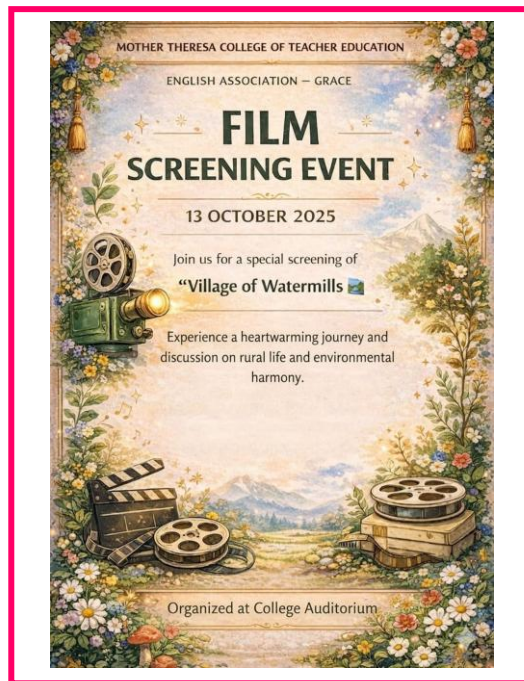
ENGLISH ASSOCIATION REPORT OF 2025-2026 ACADEMIC YEAR

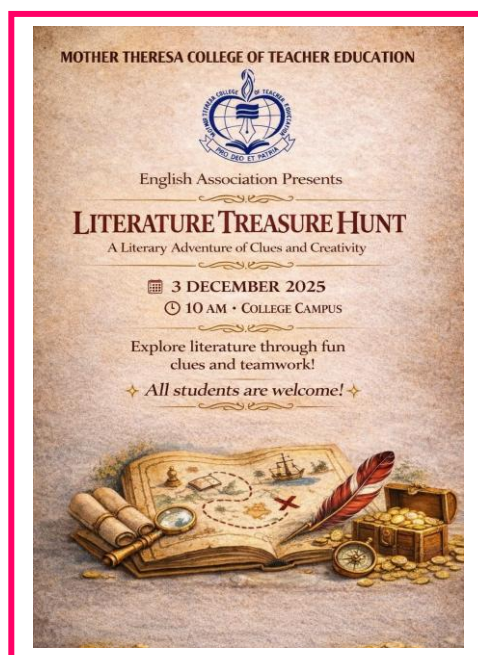


LITERATURE TREASURE HUNT

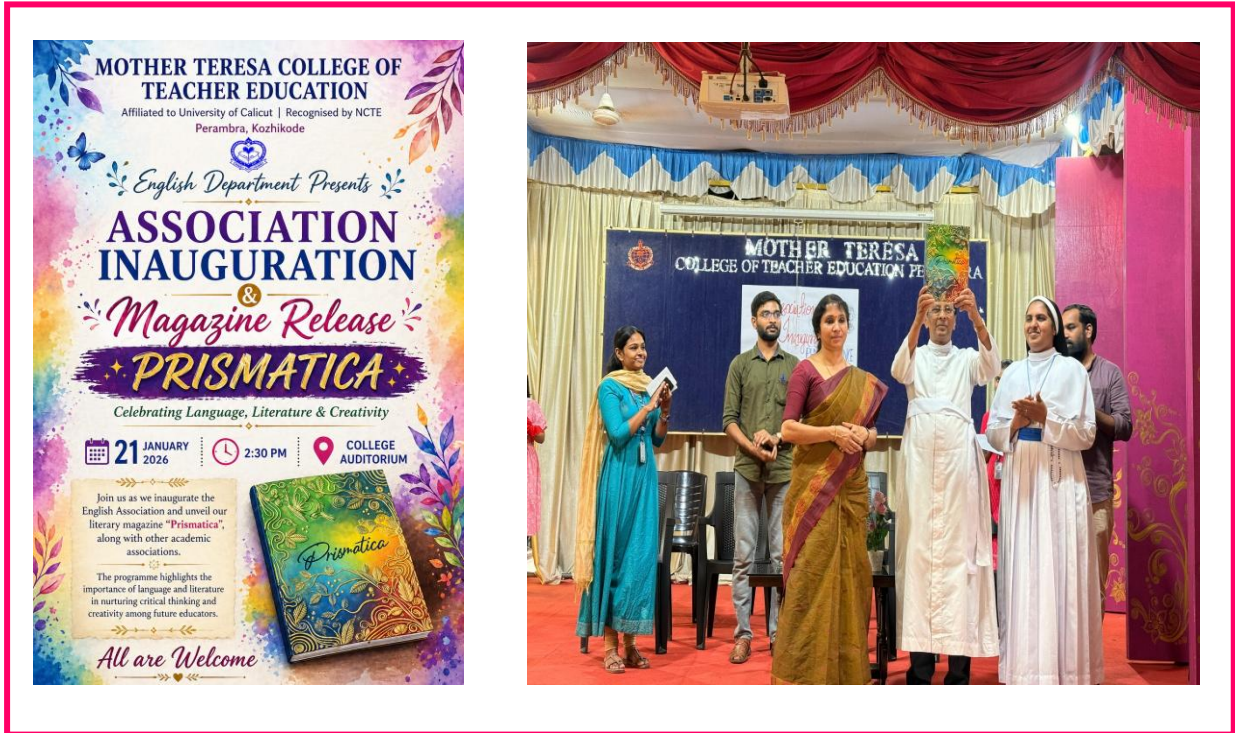
ENGLISH ASSOCIATION INAUGURATION

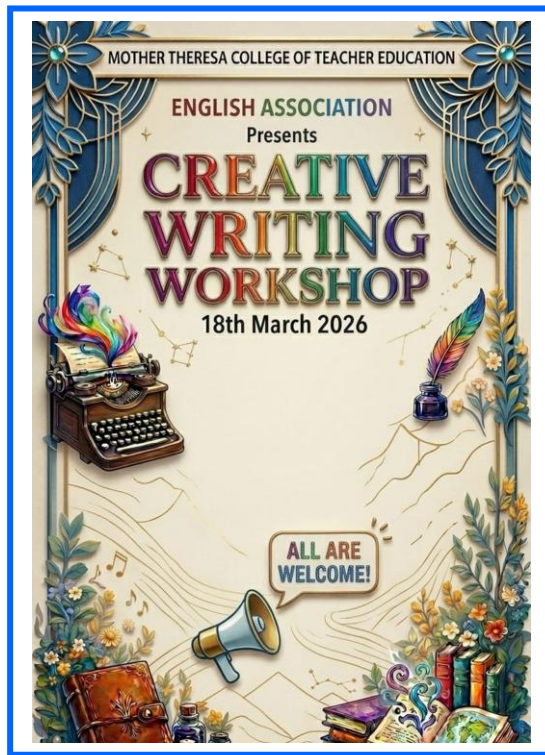
